

Off Road Club gears up for Wittittrin 200

The annual Scotts Hydraulic Services Wittittrin 200 Off Road Race is scheduled for May 29/30 and members of the Kempsey Macleay Off Road Club are being kept busy working behind the scenes to ensure the success of the race.

“We have revised the start line at Wittittrin in an effort to provide even more action in the main arena for spectators” said Club Media Representative Rod Thurgood.

“Racers will now go wheel to wheel in front of the main spectator area before sweeping through a one hundred and eighty degree turn that points them back towards the forest section. The action should be spectacular given the different power output of the numerous competing vehicles”.

“Those people who were at last year’s race will remember that Chris Browning, in his diminutive 1300cc Buggy, almost upstaged his more fancied rivals who were running V8 and Turbo Charged engines. It just goes to show how competitive Off Road Racing is, regardless of the Class” Thurgood said.

“With little rain over the past few months the track is packed hard and it should be a fast race. The wet weather last year forced us to cut the back section of the arena but that has been reinstated for this year so that’s another bonus for spectators”.

“We are expecting at least 40 entries, and given that the event is Round 3 of the State Series the competition should be fierce” stated Thurgood.
